


WHAT'S THE LATEST FROM ST BEDE'S?

Y8 boys win the cup!





Geographers hit the streets

On Wednesday March 20th our Year 7 pupils visited Ormskirk town centre to carry out some fieldwork tasks for their topic on settlements.

Here is a description of the work that the pupils completed by Grace Heffey in 7W2.

“Our geography class visited Ormskirk town centre to study the environment, the areas that are the most popular and the shops and facilities that already exist, so that we could decide what type of new business Ormskirk might need and where this business should be located.

We worked in groups and completed 3 different tasks – a land use survey (we kept a tally of how many different shops there are and how many shops are currently unused), an environmental quality survey (we rated each area on a scale of 1-5) and a pedestrian count (we timed how many people walked past us in 3 minutes) to see which area is the most popular.

From the land use data that we collected my group have decided that Ormskirk needs a cinema. We are now going to use our pedestrian count results and environmental quality survey results to decide on the best location for this cinema”.

Our Year 11 GCSE drama group visited Chester Story House on 26th Feb to see a production of 'Annie' in preparation for their final exam next month. Unsurprisingly, the drama crew found the dress up box!



Councillor Hennessey visits school



Last Friday, we were visited by Nikki Hennessey, our local county councillor. We were given the opportunity to ask her questions about her job and her role as a county councillor. She talked to us about the upcoming development of Ormskirk, including the new pool and also about the types of problems and concerns she deals with. Miss Skidmore told me, 'I found Nikki's visit very interesting, learning a lot about being a councillor. I think that it was really good for all the pupils involved as it may encourage everyone to get involved and help out in the local community'. The students really enjoyed the sessions which took place during Miss Skidmore and Miss Kelly's RE classes.

One student explained, 'When Nicki Hennessey visited it was very exciting for the whole class as we got to spend a lesson questioning a councillor and giving our views to her. It was a very interesting experience for all of us. The visit was a very good opportunity for everyone and let us think about what Ormskirk will be like in the near future the most interesting part of the visit was when she gave us the insight of when we asked if she wanted to stay or leave the E.U she said stay when she returned the question few wanted to leave'.

Another student added, 'The day Nikki Hennessey came to our class was an exciting day for everyone. It was fascinating, intuitive and inspiring. The whole class was intrigued by the stories that Nikki told us and the responses she gave to our questions. Nikki talked about her job as if it was a paid hobby and that she would never change it. She told us the important responsibilities that a counsellor and borough counsellor has to deal with on a daily basis and gave us some insights of what is to come to Ormskirk over the next couple of years. Nikki was very polite and patient with our class, answering every question that we threw at her no matter what it was about'.

We are very grateful for Councillor Hennessey giving up her time and we look forward to welcoming her again in the future.


Unilever Presentation Day by Mr Oakley

On Thursday 21st March St. Bede's Unilever Bright Future group travelled back to Port Sunlight for the Bright Future presentation day. Pupils have been working tirelessly since November, getting together on Wednesday evenings to come up with a product idea and a sales pitch to present to Unilever staff. As mentioned in our blog post after the first trip, our pupils have decided to create a hair or skincare product that is entirely plastic free.

One group designed a product that would be solid soap flower petals, designed to be stored in a glass jar. One petal would be used per wash, and this would cut down on plastic hand soap containers, providing an easy and appealing alternate. Our second group designed a product that was a sustainable shampoo bar, shaped as an egg. This would be stored in a standard egg box, however the eggs themselves would be completely customisable. Different ingredients, different hair needs, different styles and designs – the possibilities would be endless!



Pupils needed to learn about different design techniques, marketing strategies and market research. They had to create inspiration collages, mock designs, displays, as well as prepare a 10 minute speech to deliver to sell their product. They needed to consider how the product would be made, costing, target demographics, where their niche in the market was and how to make it profitable.



The two groups had to present 6 times to different pairs of Unilever staff – including some very high up people! The pupils were an absolute credit to themselves, St. Bede's, and everybody that has supported them along the way. The way they presented to the judges was mature, professional and confident. I had

a huge amount of positive feedback from other teachers and pupils from other schools that were competing about our presentations and project ideas.

We hope that this is something that the pupils will remember for a long time, as this could just be the thing that inspires somebody to pursue a career in science.

Did you know?
One in five cars in the morning rush hour is taking children to school

How Can You Help?

- ✓ Keep your speed down
- ✓ Turn your engine off if leaving your vehicle
- ✓ Leave the middle of the road free, with enough room for other road users to easily pass through
- ✓ Make sure your child leaves and enters your vehicle safely onto the pavement
- ✓ Check for pedestrians and cyclists before opening a car door
- ✓ Leave enough room on pavements for pedestrians to get past
- ✓ Take care when reversing

Please Keep Clear...

- ✓ Zig Zags and School Entrances
- ✓ Dropped Kerbs
- ✓ Resident's Driveways
- ✓ Opposite or within 10 meters of a junction- so that children can see cars and cars can see children

Your questions answered...

Can I double park if I remain in my vehicle?
No, vehicles parked in the middle of a road cause obstruction for all road users and may obstruct the line of sight for pedestrians and children crossing the road.

Am I okay to park on zigzag markings if I am only there a few minutes?
No, under no circumstances should you park on zig zag markings at any time, these are there to protect school entrances and leave a clear view of the street for pedestrians.

Don't Forget...
Congestion around schools is one of the main reasons given for dangerous parking and there are other ways you could do the school run.

Have you considered...

- Walking or cycling to school instead? This is a great way to contribute to a child's 60 minutes of activity a day and is easy to incorporate into your daily routine. Try it once a week at first and see how easy it can be.
- Parking nearby or getting off the bus two stops earlier and walking the rest of the way. If you live too far away to walk or need your car for your commute to work you can still walk part of the way. Doing this everyday could add up to an adult's recommended 30 minutes of moderate exercise, 5 times a week.
- Car Sharing is a great way to reduce congestion and save you pennies. Team up with other parents or carers who live nearby- share the cost and halve the hassle.

Important notice for parents

Find out more about SEND provision in Lancashire

If your child has a special educational need or disability you may be interested in finding out more about what is on offer in Lancashire to support their needs.

As their website explains: 'The Lancashire SEND Partnership was formed following the Ofsted and the Care Quality Commission (CQC) joint inspection of our special educational needs and disability (SEND) services.

The partnership brings together all the agencies in Lancashire which provide the SEND services for children, young people, their parents and carers. It ensures everybody can work together to deliver the best outcomes for children, young people and their families.

The report by Ofsted and CQC highlighted a number of significant areas of weakness, which is a concern to everyone involved. Since the report was published we have established the SEND Partnership Board produced an action plan, made some significant changes to improve key areas of services and recruited new people to the team.






