



School Map




School Map

Black blazer with embroidered badge for Years 7 - 10

White blouse (long or short sleeves)

Tie – blue with red, black and yellow stripes for Years 7 – 10 and blue with school crest for Year 11

Grey box pleat St Bede's skirt – **no other styles acceptable; must be knee-length** or

Grey box pleat pinafore- **no other styles acceptable; must be knee-length** or Black trousers

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

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Personal Appearance & Standards

First Impressions Count!

- Uniform should be worn in the correct manner
- Shirts tucked in at all times.
- No jewellery allowed except one pair of studded earrings (plain gold or silver) in the lower lobe of each ear and a wristwatch.
- No chewing gum allowed.
- No make-up or nail-varnish is allowed. Pupils will be asked to remove make-up or nail varnish and excessive jewellery if deemed inappropriate.
- Hairstyles should be acceptable for school.

Be proud of your personal appearance.

How do we manage this?

• If any pupil persistently defies the personal appearance standard, and we are concerned about this and if it does not improve, we will contact home to achieve the right outcome.

Rewards/Celebrations

- Achievement points are awarded for a variety of reasons including good uniform, outstanding effort and being helpful. Staff will also choose a pupil of the Lesson for each lesson throughout the day.
- Achievement points are awarded half termly for attendance.
- Celebration Assemblies are held throughout the year to reward pupils.
- There are many school events that recognise positive attitude to school and pupils who
 meet their expected standard will be part of the events held in recognition of this.
- We organise many events that are extra to our normal school curriculum. Pupils will be notified of these throughout the school year.

Anti-Bullying Code

Every pupil at St Bede's School has the right to enjoy their education free from intimidation and worry, both in school and in the surrounding community.

Our School Community will not tolerate any unkind actions or remarks, even if they were not intended to hurt.

Pupils should support each other by reporting all instances of bullying.

Bullying will be dealt with by school staff.

If you think you are being bullied, TELL AN ADULT AT HOME OR AT SCHOOL

If you cannot do this, ask your parents to contact school. Reporting bullying is a positive action.

It is better to report any bullying so it can be resolved.

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FAQ

If I am upset or anxious—what can I do?

Speak to your Form Tutor or your Year Leader and if this does not help you find a member of the Safeguarding team - ask at Student Services. Remember to let your parents know about your feelings as they need to be aware so they can support you as well.

What do I do if I feel ill?

During lesson time let your teacher know and they will refer you to Student Services — do not worry if they ask for another member of staff to help, this is just to make sure you are safe leaving the classroom.

At other times alert a member of the duty team (they will be wearing a hi - vis vest) or go to Student Services and you will be looked after.

Am I allowed to use my mobile phone?

No. However, if you really need to contact home, please go to Student Services and we will help you out with your request — it must be a really important message.

Where can I get help with homework?

Firstly, ask your teacher. If you are still struggling, we have some homework clubsafter school run be out TA's. Please speak to Miss Palmer to find out more.

If I am late for school, what do I do?

You need to sign in at the main reception and the receptionist will check if we know about your reason for being late or if there is no reason you will be advised what todo.

I have friendship issues, or someone is being mean to me and/or myfriend who can help?

Speak to your Form Tutor or your Year Leader. If this does not help you find a member of the Safeguarding team - ask at Student Services.

FAQ

If I do not know my log in for ClassCharts or my school email, who can help me?

Ask either your form teacher or Student Services and they will be able to help you. If you cannot log on to a school computer, you will need to speak to our IT department.

What clubs are available?

There are several clubs that take place at lunchtime or after school. Once the extra-curricular timetable has been published, it will be shared with your form teacher so they can let you know what clubs are on and when.

How do I pay for my dinner?

To pay for your lunch, break food or use any of the school vending machines, you will need to use our fingerprint or PIN number. This will be sorted on your first day. As long as your school account has enough money on it, you will be able to purchase items. If you do run out of money, we will still provide you with a lunch, we just ask that your account is topped up by the following day.



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
